Given the recent "Stay Safe, Stay at Home" executive order, all Birth to Three Programs shall have all staff working from home using Remote Early Intervention (EI) for all EI services as posted in both procedures on our website at <https://www.birthe23.org/providers/provider-resources/procedures/>.

As always, please encourage all staff to continue to implement good public health practices to prevent the spread of respiratory viruses. These practices include frequent handwashing, covering their mouth with their sleeve or a tissue when coughing or sneezing, avoiding touching their eyes, nose or mouth with their hands and most importantly staying home when they are sick.
